Canvas Credit Union delivers a Christmas Miracle



On Wednesday (December 18, 2019), exactly a week before Christmas. Canvas Credit Union CEO, Todd Marksberry, presented a \$60,000 check to Aurora Public Schools Superintendent, Rico Munn.

The money will help pay off the lunch debt at 18 Title I schools in Aurora.

"The debt can get into the six figures. When you can cut into that, it frees up resources to hire teachers to provide more curriculum to do things that kids need to be supported," Munn said. Read the full Denver7 story here.

As of this tax year the new Donate to a Colorado Nonprofit, or ReFUND CO, program allows taxpayers to choose to directly support an eligible Colorado-registered charity with a simple designation on their state income tax return.

To participate, you can look for the "Donate to a Colorado Nonprofit" line of your tax return or tax software and enter Aurora Public Schools Foundation and our registration

number, 20023004598.

Last year alone, the state of Colorado issued almost \$1 billion in refunds to 1.9 million tax payers. Even if individuals only donated half, or one-third of their refunds, that could equal over \$333 million in philanthropic support for nonprofits in Colorado.
