Work-based learning, or the opportunity for students to participate in hands-on, real world experiences in a career field, is a priority for the Aurora Public Schools Foundation. This past year, we have supported over 6,250 APS students with work-based learning opportunities.

These experiences include:

• **Learning About Work** through career fairs, panels with industry speakers, and worksite tours;

• Learning Through Work with clinical experiences, internships, supervised project experience, and industry sponsored projects;

• And Learning At Work with apprenticeships, on-the-job training, and employee development.

This year, Aurora Public Schools and the APS
Foundation have partnered up with the Denver Broncos
Foundation to make a huge impact for our students,
schools, and community! Through the generous support of

Elementary School were treated to an exciting book fair
where every child got to choose four brand-new books to
take home free of cost. Helping to foster a love for reading
and to ensure that students have access to books at home.
The Denver Broncos Foundation's commitment doesn't stop
there; they have helped create a safe and engaging space
for kids to play and grow with the construction of a brandnew playground at Montview through KABOOM!

At Gateway High School and its feeder middle and elementary schools, the Denver Broncos Foundation has sponsored a Secondary Pathway Specialist position. This key role will focus on expanding work-based learning opportunities and providing post-secondary support to students as they prepare for life after graduation. From internships to career readiness programs, this investment will empower students to explore diverse career paths, setting them up for success.

Middle school girls across the district are also benefiting from the Denver Broncos Foundation's investment by helping launch Aurora Public School's first-ever middle school girls flag football program. Further, the Denver Broncos Foundation has provided new helmets for the Vista PEAK Preparatory football team, ensuring that our student-athletes have the protection they need to play safely.





Since the opening of the Educator Emporium, over 1,000 teachers from all 63 APS schools have been able to gather supplies! In the fall of 2021, the Educator Emporium, a no-cost school supplies "store" for APS educators, was launched to help prevent educators from needing to spend their own money on supplies for their classrooms. In January, 2024, the APS Foundation moved the Emporium from a donated space, provided by our generous partners at The District Credit Union, to a modular building on the Aurora Public Schools District campus.

The Emporium is primarily staffed by community volunteers, like the William Smith High School

Rudder Club, the Gaylord Rockies and Visit Aurora volunteer teams.
Funding and supplies for the Emporium comes from generous individual,

corporation, and grant donations.

Our Mission is to cultivate community investment to enrich student opportunity.


