Each year, the Aurora Public Schools Foundation supports APS in creating and expanding extraordinary learning opportunities that extend beyond the classroom. Space Day at Buckley Space Force Base is a shining example of what's possible when community, curiosity, and innovation collide.

This year, more than 400 APS middle and high school students participated in a full day of immersive, hands-on STEM experiences at Buckley Space Force Base. Throughout the day, students participated in a variety of activities, including:

• Launching their own foam rockets, learning the basics of aerodynamics and propulsion

• Programming line-tracking and color-sensing robots, sharpening skills in coding and automation

 Traveling through the cosmos using virtual reality headsets, sparking awe and wonder about the universe

 Speaking one-on-one with experts in aerospace, aviation, and military careers, gaining insight into real-world applications of STEM education

Experiences like Space Day are more than exciting field trips—they are transformational moments that can define a student's future. By making STEM accessible, inspiring, and engaging, we help prepare students to become the innovators, engineers, and explorers of tomorrow.

Launch of Innovation Grants for APS Educators

In 2025, we started the **Innovation Grant Program**, designed to inspire and elevate the creativity of APS educators and staff. This new initiative reflects our belief that bold, forward-thinking ideas can unlock inspiration and a world of possibility for students across the district.

Through this grant program, we provide funding for innovative instructional practices, transformative technology, and dynamic projects that align with both the Foundation's mission and the strategic priorities of Aurora Public Schools. From reimagining classroom engagement to expanding real-world learning experiences, these grants are already making a powerful impact.

Here are just a few of the inspiring projects funded this year:

- Altura Elementary School expanded its STEM programming with cutting-edge 3D printing and smart robotics, empowering young innovators to design, build, and explore.
- Clara Brown Entrepreneurial Academy is partnering with YouthBiz to deliver engaging workshops led by local youth entrepreneurs, sparking interest in business and leadership, and training teachers to foster young entrepreneurs.
- **Mrachek Middle School** welcomed "The Snake Man"; a hands-on, live animal presentation that brought science to life for curious learners.

We are excited to continue supporting APS educators in shaping innovative, meaningful learning experiences that prepare our students for success in school and beyond!




